Fall is finally here and our year is coming to an end. But before it does, I want to bring you up to date on what is happening in the lodge. Our fall induction / service weekends are over and our turnout was good. I would like to thank everyone who helped us achieve the 30% brotherhood conversion rate we needed to fulfill one of the requirements for Quality Lodge for 2010. The lodge leadership especially appreciates the efforts of the members who made a special trip to camp and sealed their membership in the rain. As I write this article we are currently 10 members short of positive growth for the year and that is the last requirement we need to complete for recognition as a 2010 Quality Lodge.

The properties committee has approved the concept for the addition of lean-to's and a program shelter at Camp Stonehaven which will be designed and built under the leadership of Falling Waters Chapter. The lodge is in the process of completing the application for a National Service Grant to help Falling Waters finance this project and I will keep you up to date on the process as more information becomes available.

The membership of the lodge has also worked very hard this year to support the council and

our camps. We have recorded more than 2000 service hours above last years totals and we are not done yet. Next year should be even better, we will have at least two additional opportunities for cheerful service. The first is SummitCorps which will take place at the new national scout reservation in West Virginia next July. The lodge is planning on sending a contingent and more information will be coming out very soon. The second opportunity is Legacy 11, this will be a project similar to Arrowcorps 5 which was held a few years ago, but this time it will be conducted in Western New York.

Mona Lloyd and her committee have a great event planned for next fall and I encourage everyone to take part in this unique opportunity.

As a lot of you know, I am always saying the OA is not all work, IT'S FUN TOO. So mark your calendars, Friday December 10 will be our annual bowling night, this year it will be held at Thruway Lanes in Cheektowaga. The annual Vigil breakfast is December 18th and the fliers and registration info are on the web. Our annual Winter Fellowship is planned for February 18, 19 & 20 at Camp Stonehaven, plans are already being made and it looks like it will be more fun than ever before. Last but not least,

the annual lodge banquet will be on March 6th at Bowmansville Fire Hall. The committee planning this year's event has proposed some changes to make it a more enjoyable evening for all.

Hello all,

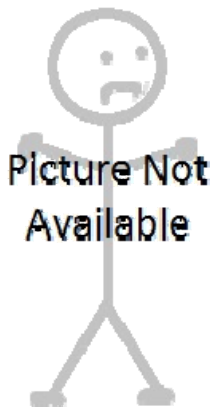

Hello all,

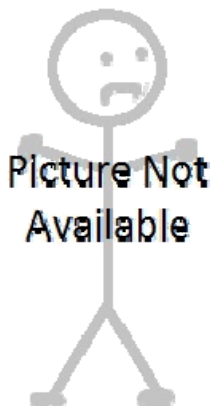

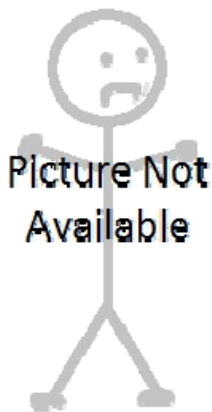
Roncone. Until we meet each other on the trails.

A Word From The Chapter Chief of Falling Waters



Greetings from Falling Waters and Chris Swagler, your 2010/2011 Chapter Chief

As of this writing, we have finished a very small but successful Ordeal Weekend at Camp Stonehaven, completing projects that continue to help maintain the camp. This fall, despite the rain, we were able to complete the following...install 2 new drain pipes under the upper road, paint the latrine by Safari, mow & weed wack, paint the sign out on Route 425 and do some electrical wiring in the Leaders Lodge. We also had 2 new ordeal members and 12 brotherhood members inducted to our Lodge. Many thanks to the ceremonial team led by Mr. Rositter and Bates for making the quick change to Cabin 2. They did a great job at the last minute creating a memorable ceremony in a small space.

If you didn't make it out to our last Chapter meeting in September, please remember that the November 9th and December 14th meetings will be held at the Gander Mountain store on Youngs St. in Tonawanda at 7pm. We are trying to create a theme at each meeting and will have use of the archery range or access to

other store training that we haven't had in the past. Our goal is to see more people have some fun at these meetings. Bring a fellow OA member.

In our chapter, we are still looking for someone to help with the Trading post at our events and weekends. The job is fairly easy but just takes someone to watch over it.

This fall, we have also been busy working on our application to National OA for a 2010 service grant. A limited number of service grants are made available each year to those Lodges that fulfill the requirements of Quality Lodge. Last spring, we had talked about building a Campmaster building at Stonehaven but unfortunately, the newer building codes drove our cost well over the \$20,000 limit of the service grant program. We decided in our October chapter meeting and were approved by the Lodge at the LEC and the Council to submit a request for funding of 2 new lean to's and a small pavilion to be used as a program area at Stonehaven. We are estimating the project to be under \$20,000 and we could

be eligible for a maximum grant of \$5,000 if we win the award from National OA. If selected, we would begin fundraising this winter with the goal of breaking ground in the spring. We would also remove two of the oldest, unusable lean to's that are between Leaders Lodge and Lodge 1. Let's keep our fingers crossed...we should have an answer by January 2011! Ask Santa for a hammer...we'll need everyone's help to pull this project together.

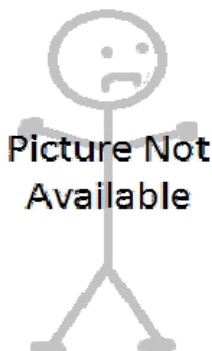

The details are not final at this time, but here is what we have at this moment.

Date: July 17-23, 2011

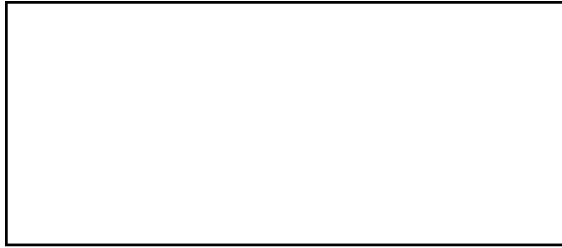
Cost: Projected \$250 national fee, PLUS transportation. The lodge is exploring group transportation depending on the number who choose to serve.
