A Word From the Lodge Advisor

Dear Brothers in the Wimachtendienk

On February 2nd, 2009 I was officially named the new Advisor for Ho-De-No-Sau-Nee Lodge 159 of the Order Of The Arrow. For those of you who may not know me, I am a 30+ year member of the Greater Niagara Frontier Council and have just completed my term as the Chairman of the Council's Camping Committee. I received my Vigil Honor in 1974 as a youth after serving both as a chapter and lodge officer and have been serving for the last 12 years as the senior advisor to the Silver Lakes and Seneca Chapters ceremonial Teams.

I am making these points to show that I have been both a youth officer, a Chapter Advisor and an Advisor to various committees in the lodge in the past and am no stranger to the workings of our lodge in both good times and bad. It is now time for all arrowmen and women in our council to step up and help us rebuild our lodge so it can prosper and begin to again provide the type of leadership and service we are capable of doing for both our units and our camps.

We as a lodge are just beginning this process and need everyone's help. In the months since I became Lodge Advisor, we have made many changes and are planning even more. All of the Chapters will no longer be holding their monthly chapter meetings at the same time & location as the district roundtables, starting in September all 3 chapters will have separate times meeting times and locations. During these monthly meeting, there will be a business session where the chapter membership will review and discuss what is going on in the chapters, the lodge and the Order which will then be followed by some type of fellowship activity. Each chapter will have a full slate of youth officers just like the lodge, and in addition to their Advisor, they will have two Associate Advisors, one responsible for Program and one responsible for Service. Remember, the Order of the Arrow is a youth run organization and that is the way we plan on running it. The Advisors at all levels of our organization will be there to advise and guide the youth members as they perform their duties, not do it for them.

Since February, we have successfully held our winter fellowship weekend, Conducted elections for new lodge and chapter

officers, provided Lodge Leadership Development training for 31 new officers and advisors and sponsored a National Leadership Seminar at Scouthaven which provided the opportunity for 12 of our members to attend a regional training event along with 29 people from other lodges in the Northeast Region. In addition we have completed our service weekends at all 3 council camps where we inducted over 130 new members and conducted our annual Broomball tournament where almost 100 members enjoyed a night of fun and fellowship.

Our schedule of events gets even better, 45 of our members attended NOAC in August and the new NE3A section is held its first conclave at Camp Woodlands on August 14-15-16 where our lodge was running the Saturday evening show. And last but not least, to cap off our summer activities, we will be hosting our own Lodge Summer Fellowship Weekend and Vigil Honor Induction, August 28-30 at Schoellkopf Scout Reservation.

We are now in the process of updating our lodge records and attempting to contact every member of our council who was ever inducted into the Order of the Arrow. Our records are very limited and we want to correct that, if you are an O.A. member or know someone who was, please let them know we are alive and rebuilding for the future and need everyone's help.

Our Chief, Jim Prowse is in the process of appointing Youth Chairmen, and I am in the process of appointing Advisors and Associate Advisors to every lodge committee. These positions will not be filled by a group of people from one chapter or district, but will be composed of people from throughout the lodge. So, if you are interested in becoming more active in our lodge, no matter what your age or position, please let one of us know and we will do our best to find a place for you either at the lodge or chapter level.

We are also working very hard to complete the requirements for Quality Lodge. This designation is very much like the Quality Unit recognition your Pack, Troop, Post or Crews try to earn every year. The difference with the Order of The Arrow Quality Lodge program is that by achieving this designation, we are eligible to apply for National Service Grants and Camping Awards that will help bring special funding

to our Council for O.A. supported projects. As of July 15, 2009, we have completed 13 of the 15 requirements for Quality Lodge. The two remaining requirements are positive growth, which means we need 44 additional O.A. members to pay their 2009 dues and Brotherhood Conversions.

If you have been an Ordeal member of the O.A. for at least 10 months, please help us attain Quality Lodge by attending one of our 3 service weekends this September and sealing your membership by becoming Brotherhood. I am especially appealing to those long time members who help us by paying their dues every year but are still ordeal members, years and in some cases decades, after they were inducted into our Lodge. We are required to "convert" a minimum of 30% of our ordeal membership to Brotherhood every year, this includes the people who have been Ordeals for 5, 10 or even 20 years! Please help, come out this fall and seal your membership.


