A Word from the Lodge Chief

Fellow Arrowmen,

This year has gone by so fast, I hope you and your families had a wonderful holiday season. I can hardly believe it is already January. During this past year we have gone through many changes in our Lodge. We had sent a contingent to Arrowcorps 5 this summer, which was a large service project that would consist of arrowmen spending several days at a national park around the nation providing cheerful service in building trails, helping in the removal of invasive species in the area, and much more. I am sure all of those who went definitely enjoyed their chance to be a part of that great opportunity.

To go along with these changes, our lodge, as well as all of the lodges in our region, were realigned. This means that lodges were being assigned different sections based upon their geographic locations. Our lodge, as well as four other lodges in the section stayed as being in section 3A for the Northeast Region. The other three lodges in our section went south and become part of a section that is located in Pennsylvania. NOAC 2009 Will Be Theme Driven

New Health Form Available Now

The National Office of the Boy Scouts of America has developed a new and comprehensive medical form. This form will replace the current BSA Medical forms. In the past, the Medical Staff for the National Order of the Arrow Conference has required that everyone attending the conference have a current BSA Class 3 Medical Form. This form needed to be completed within 12 months prior to attending the National Order of the Arrow Conference.

As you prepare for the 2009 National Order of the Arrow Conference you will need to make sure that you use the correct medical form. The new form is available on the NOAC registration website [LINK - https://registration.oa-bsa.org/guides/documents/Medical_34605.pdf]. All other forms will not be accepted at the conference. Please download the form and complete it with your medical provider. Please make sure that the form has all of the appropriate signatures.


